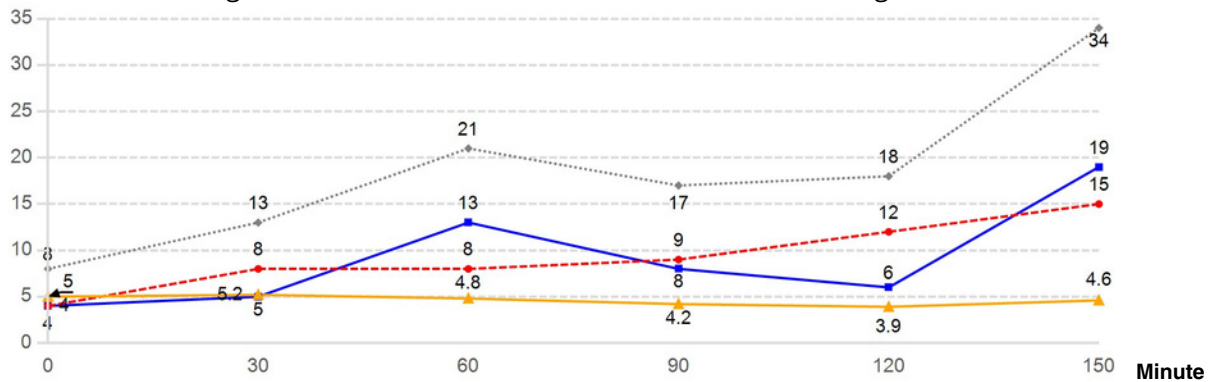

Notes:

Small intestinal bacterial overgrowth refers to a group of clinical syndromes caused by abnormal numbers and types of bacteria in the small intestine due to various reasons, which is a typical imbalance of the intestinal microecology. The "ACG Clinical Guideline" recommends the use of hydrogen breath tests for detection in patients with symptoms (abdominal pain, bloating, abdominal distension, and/or diarrhea); repeated use of antibiotics can be avoided; improvement of symptoms and treatment effectiveness are confirmed by the retesting of the normalization of gas levels. Intestinal Methanogen Overgrowth (IMO), methanogens are not bacteria but archaea, and they can overgrow not only in the small intestine but also in the colon, such as Methanobrevibacter smithii. Studies have shown that methane can enhance contractility and delay the propagation velocity of ileal peristalsis by affecting cholinergic neurons. The "ACG Clinical Guideline" recommends the use of methane breath tests to diagnose patients with symptomatic constipation.
